Guidelines for Presentation

1. Upload an one-slide PDF file. Other format will not be accepted.
2. Please use your last name as the file name, e.g. "lastname.pdf".
3. The file has to be static, e.g. no movement, sounds, zoom in/out, animations, etc.
4. No additional props, e.g. costumes, instruments, equipment, etc.
5. Presentation is limited to 5 minutes only.
6. Presentations are considered to have commenced when a presenter starts his or her presentation through speech.
7. **The decision of the adjudicating panel is final and will be announced on 3/8 (Monday).**
8. Speakers are responsible for the copyright for content presented.
9. A file is attached as a template for your reference.

Guidelines for Judging

Judges will be comprised of UTSA and off-UTSA faculties

Comprehension and Content

- Did the presentation provide an understanding of the background and significance to the research question being addressed while explaining terminology and avoiding jargon?
- Did the presentation clearly describe the impact and/or results of the research, including conclusions and outcomes?
- Did the presentation follow a clear and logical sequence?
- Was the thesis topic, research significance, results/impact and outcomes communicated in language appropriate to a non-specialist audience?
- Did the presenter spend adequate time on each element of their presentation - or did they elaborate for too long on one aspect or was the presentation rushed?

Engagement and Communication

- Did the oration make the audience want to know more?
- Was the presenter careful not to trivialise or generalise their research?
- Did the presenter convey enthusiasm for their research?
- Did the presenter capture and maintain their audience's attention?
- Did the speaker have sufficient stage presence, eye contact and vocal range; maintain a steady pace, and have a confident stance?
- Did the PowerPoint slide enhance the presentation - was it clear, legible, and concise?
