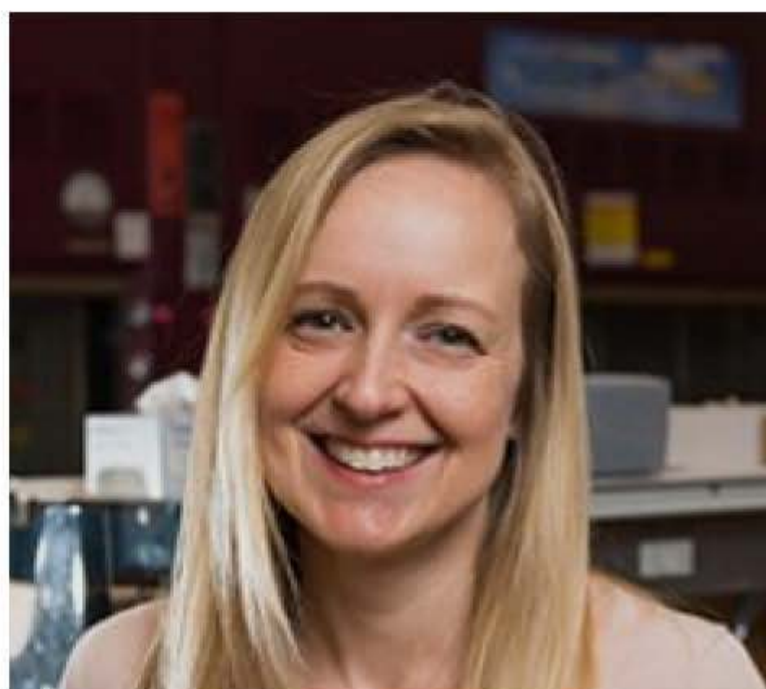


Writing-to-Learn in STEM
